Pack these items in a day bag to keep with you, as your luggage may not arrive at your stateroom until a few hours after the ship leaves port.

- Medication (in their original containers)
- Passport and/or [required citizenship documentation](#)
- Camera and accessories (batteries, memory card, etc.)
- Extra prescription glasses or contact lenses
- Sunscreen or hat
- Swimsuit and cover-up
- Cruise documents
- Money (cash and credit cards)
- Insurance cards
- Jewelry and other valuables
- Tissues
- Hand sanitizer
- Phone and charger
- Pen and a pad of paper
- Gum or mints

Disney Cruise Line ships feature an array of diverse dining experiences, from casual to upscale. Be sure to follow the dress code for your restaurant:

- Main Dining - Dining attire is cruise casual in all 3 main dining restaurants, meaning no swimwear or tank tops. Guests often like to dress up, but this is optional.
- Adult Exclusive Dining at Palo/Remy - To preserve the elegant ambiance of this restaurant, you are asked to adhere to a dress code when dining at Palo or Remy. We recommend dress pants or slacks and a collared shirt for men, and a dress, skirt or pants and a blouse for women. Jeans may also be worn if in good condition (no holes). Please no tank tops, swimsuits, swimsuit cover-ups, shorts, hats, cut-offs, torn clothing, t-shirts with offensive language and/or graphics, flip-flops or tennis shoes. 1 Exercise outfit - So you have no excuse not to visit the gym if that's your thing!

2 Sets of Pajamas

Sweatshirt or a light jacket

Appropriate shoes (sandals/Sneakers/watershoes)

Even if you do not plan on needing a pair of tennis shoes, pack them just in case. Some ports and excursions involve a lot of walking or walking across uneven pavement or rocks

Personal Items/Toiletries

- Make up
- Deodorant
- Shampoo and conditioner

This available in your stateroom, but you may want your own

- Body wash or soap
- Toothbrush
- Toothpaste
- Floss
- Hair brush
- Hair dryer - provided - but if you want your own
- Curling iron or straightener
- Hair accessories (Bobby pins, ponytail holders, clips...)
- Stain remover
- Lotion
- Sewing kit
- Shaving cream
- Lint brush
- Razor
- Medicine Kit (Pain reliever, contraceptives, nausea and diarrhea remedies, Band-Aids, antacids, cold medicine, tissues, hand sanitizer)

Tip: Although most of these can be purchased onboard in the event that you forget them, they are expensive.

Electronics

- Extension cords are not allowed - however - you can find cruise approved non-surge protector outlet extenders.
- Computer and charger
- Camera, batteries/charger, memory card

Video camera and charger (if you have a separate one)

Leisure

Sunscreen

Sun hat

Sunglasses

Books/Magazines

Under water camera (optional but fun!)

Guidebook or journal

Carrying bag or tote (This will be helpful for carrying items around the ship as well as on excursions)

Tip: Pirate night is a fun night where people go from low key pirate gear to all out costumes - be creative, and have fun! (no play weapons allowed)

Tip: Try to only bring what you know you will need. You may need room in your suitcase to hold souvenirs on the way home.

Tip: use reusable bags to organize nightly outfits - pack the families together, that way you know you have everything.
